Instructions

NOTE WHEEL GUARD is NOT a wheel cleaner

1 CLEANING

This is the most important part of the process !!

Clean wheel thoroughly, you may at this stage use a wheel cleaning product.

For best results remove the wheel so that the inside rim is cleaned as well, although this is not necessary to just clean and coat the outside of the wheel.

If the wheels are pitted with ingrained stains these must be removed at this stage with a hard brush or as described on the wheel cleaners directions. It is important that ALL dirt is removed as your **WHEEL GUARD** is a crystal and remain visible.

2 PREPERATION

Once you are happy with the cleanliness of your wheels wash down with a mild soapy water solution such as washing up liquid to remove and neutralize any trace of the wheel cleaner and acids.

Now rinse thoroughly with fresh water to remove any soap.

Allow to dry.

If your wheels are unpainted bare metal, alloy or chrome it is recommended to wipe down with de-natured alcohol to ensure there is no grease present that will stop the **WHEEL GUARD** adhering. (Mentholated spirit is also good)

3 APPLICATION

Remove Cap and pull out ring pull insert.

Make sure wheel is completely dry, in every nook and cranny.

Pour a small amount of **WHEEL GUARD** into a tin tray or small paint roller tray. Use a lint free cloth or applicator pad and soak up the coating. Apply to the wheel to get full coverage, but avoid runs, you can wipe them away as you see them and before drying. Allow to dry. Depending on temperature **WHEEL GUARD** be touch dry in 5 to 20 minutes. **DO NOT** try to touch up missed areas during the drying process.

Applying 2nd Coat recommended especially for winter use.

Because **WHEEL GUARD** is crystal clear it is easy to miss small areas so a second coat is recommended and will ensure maximum protection. Once the first coat is hard, (usually 1 to 2) hours apply a second coat directly onto the first. Allow 24 hours to cure, although you may use the vehicle after only a couple of hours.
